What is AACS Doing to Fight the GE Rule



- A complaint was filed in Federal Court, Northern District of Texas, Fort Worth Division opposing the new rule December 2023 by AACS & Duvall's School of Cosmetology, Bedford, TX
- Case assigned to Judge Reed Charles
 O'Connor (Appointed by Pres. George W.
 Bush)
- The Department of Ed has responded
- Judge issued the scheduling order

GE Lawsuit Recent Developments



- Second complaint filed against DOE regarding GE. Ogle School Management, LLC & Tricocci University of Beauty Culture in the same federal district court.
 - Owned by NCK Capital Michael Kornman
 - Represented by Paul Clement (Chevron Case)
 - Complaints are very similar
 - Ogle & Tricocci also filed Temporary Restraining Order (TRO) – Must show immediate, irreparable harm.
 - Lawsuits may be consolidated

GE Lawsuit Recent Developments



• Department of Education announced that it is delaying the initial GE reporting until October 1, 2024.

DOE in Hot Water



- Multiple lawsuits filed against the Department
- Recent major ruling on BDR in favor of plaintiff
- Higher Education and Workforce
 Development Subcommittee attacks DOE for mismanaging the rollout of the new FAFSA
- Rep. Virgina Foxx calls for Secretary
 Cardona's resignation and pressed
 Government Accountability Office to
 investiage the department of Education

150% Certification Rule



- The Department of Education will no longer approve programs that above the state minimum Hours
- The new rule takes effect July 1, 2024
- Department of Education released guidance that it will use discretion before enforcing punitive measures for failure to comply with the new rule.
- Support the Clock House Program Student Protection Act (HB 7810)

New Draft Rules



- DOE is proposing to eliminate asynchronous delivery of online education by non-degree programs
- DOE is examining how students agree to the bundling of books and kits into their financial aid packaes.
