What is Not in the Sunset Review

- No Quantifiable Metrics
- No Complaint Resolution timelines
- No approval turnaround targets
- No Enforcement Outcome Benchmarks
- No Segmented enforcement outcome by Accreditation Status
- No multi-year trend normalization
- No comparative risk indicators



When Self-Serving Becomes A Tradition

- BPPE emphasizes its operational difficulties without offering real solutions
- Created for the Bureau (no stakeholder input here)
- Traditional Bureau sunset reviews focus on incremental fixes not sustainable improvements
- Published data in sunset report can not be found on BPPE website or reproduced
- No acknowledgement that Accredited T-4 Institutions are more heavily oversighted than 50% of schools in Ca.



What Is In the Report and Accompanying Bill?

- Approximately 30 changes proposed in Report & AB 2771
- Non-degree programs not within scope of Accreditation must have written consent of Accreditor (think about that)
- Enrollment Agreement must include description of method of delivery for instruction
- Changes STRF eligibility from “while enrolled” to “in connection with enrollment” (whatever that means)
- Removes the requirement that the Bureau make publicly available the number of restraining orders, interim suspension orders and disciplinary actions



Naughty and Nice List: Announced and Unannounced Visits

- CAPPs is starting a list of BPPE staff that behave and misbehave on School Visits (either anonymous or named staff welcome)
- Many visits go well and BPPE staff should be recognized
- Some visits go poorly:
 - Hostile statements & attitude
 - Demands made of under threat of sanctions and time limits
 - Fines that emerge from the BPPE months later with no information
 - Unprofessional conduct and appearance
 - When brought to BPPE Management's attention: No response



Solutions to BPPE Funding issues are there but no will to change

- Actual number of responsible entities not counted or acknowledged
- Can't regulate when you can't count
- 11 OSARS Staff? (you can't be serious)
- No workload reviews (slowest approval time among all agencies, always the schools fault)
- Denial is more than a river in Egypt
